4. First-aid measures

7. Handling and storage

Precautions for safe handling	As a general rule, when handling USP materials, avoid all contact and inhalation of dust, mists, and/or vapors associated with the material. Select and use containment devices and personal protective equipment based on a risk assessment of material potency and exposure potential.
