Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment needed	Treat symptomatically. Treatment of anticholinergic overdose may include the following: Do not induce vomiting. Gastric decontamination may be successful, even if delayed. Administer activated charcoal as a slurry. To reverse anticholinergic delirium, administer physostigmine. For tachydysrhythmias with signs of hemodynamic instability, treat with physostigmine or intravenous beta blockers. For QRS widening or ventricular tachycardia, administer sodium bicarbonate. If sodium bicarbonate is unsuccessful, consider lidocaine. For seizures, administer intravenous diazepam or lorazepam. If seizures recur, consider phenobarbital. Monitor for hypotension, dysrhythmias, respiratory depression, and need for endotracheal intubation. Evaluate for hypoglycemia, electrolyte imbalances, and hypoxia. For agitation, with and without hypertension and tachycardia, administer intravenous benzodiazepines. For severe hypertension, administer nitroprusside, labetalol, nitroglycerin, or phentolamine. For hyperthermia, treat with external cooling and avoid phenothiazines. For hypotension, administer isotonic fluid. If hypotension persists, consider dopamine or norepinephrine. For rhabdomyolysis, administer saline. Monitor input and output, serum electrolytes, CK, and renal function. Diuretics may be necessary to maintain urine output. Urinary alkalinization is NOT recommended.
General information	Remove from exposure. Remove contaminated clothing. For treatment advice, seek guidance from an occupational health physician or other licensed health-care provider familiar with workplace chemical exposures. In the United States, the national poison control center phone number is 1-800-222-1222. If person is not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen if available. Persons developing serious hypersensitivity (anaphylactic) reactions must receive immediate medical attention.

7. Handling and storage

Precautions for safe handling

As a general rule, when handling USP Reference Standards, avoid all contact and inhalation of dust, mists, and/or vapors associated with the material. Clean equipment and work surfaces with suitable detergent or solvent after use. After removing gloves, wash hands and other exposed skin thoroughly. Select and use containment devices and personal protective equipment based on a risk assessment of material potency and exposure potential.

Store in tight container as defined in the USP-NF. This material should be handled and stored per label instructions to ensure product integrity.

No open handling. For laboratory operations, use approved ventilation or containment system (biological safety cabinet, ventilated balance enclosure, glovebox). Use a powered air-purifying respirator (PAPR) with HEPA filters, disposable outerware and head cover for spill cleanup. Choose respiratory protection appropriate to the task and the level of existing engineering controls.
